Parents have been mandated by God to nurture and support their child(ren) (Proverbs 22:6), which affirms their responsibility in education of their children.



DCS 2025-2028 Education Plan – Focus Areas

Discipleship

Destiny Christian School is creating a Play school-to-Grade 9 discipleship pathway in close partnership with Home Church’s Kids, Youth, and Bible College ministries. We are building Bible-centered lessons that emphasize spiritual formation, weekly memory verses, and school-wide rhythms of praise and prayer and whole school assemblies. Home Church Bible College students also mentor our middle-school small groups. Parents are equipped through our Family Nights, so church, home, and school speak with one discipling voice. Throughout the year, students engage in discipleship projects and milestone celebrations, and the journey culminates in an end-of-year Grade 9 retreat designed to help them reflect on their growth, solidify their identity in Christ, and launch confidently into high school as servant-hearted leaders and disciples of Jesus.

Servant Leadership

Destiny Christian School’s servant-leadership focus is shifting from the Leader in Me framework to partnerships that more directly align with our mission. For Grades K–9, we are exploring the Maxwell iLead values-based curriculum, while our middle-school cohort will attend the ACSI Servant Leadership Summit to sharpen their biblical vision of leading through service. Across all grades, students will continue to step into hands-on initiatives—volunteering on campus, serving the community and church, and mentoring younger peers. These experiences will culminate in school-wide celebrations that highlight practical growth in humility, responsibility, and influence for Christ.

Quality Christian Education

Destiny Christian School remains committed to delivering exemplary, Bible-rooted learning from Play School through Grade 9, with a focus on deepening quality rather than expanding into high school. Over the next three years we will sharpen classroom practice by (1) intensifying teacher supervision, evaluation, and growth cycles that track instructional excellence and biblical-worldview integration; (2) equipping staff through targeted professional development on faith-infused pedagogy, servant-leadership frameworks, and middle-school culture-building; and (3) weaving faith and service seamlessly into every subject so students see how God’s truth speaks to math, science, humanities, and the arts. A new *Principal Evaluation Committee* will steward an evidence-based review process aligned with the Alberta Leadership Quality Standard to ensure the principal continuously advances the school’s mission and vision. Together, these measures will cultivate a vibrant, Christ-centred culture where academic rigour, spiritual formation, and servant leadership flourish in harmony. ☒

DCS Three-Year Education Plan

DISCIPLESHIP GOAL:

Build a seamless Play-school-to-Grade 9 discipleship pathway—in partnership with Home Church Kids, Youth, and Bible College—that forms students who know Scripture, have a flourishing relationship with Jesus, are planted in the local church, and live as resilient disciples of Jesus.

Strategies:

1. **Integrated Bible Pathway** – Finalize and roll out a three-division Bible/discipleship scope-and-sequence with weekly memory verses and spiritual-formation experiences.
2. **Rhythms of Worship & Prayer** – Organize Praise & Prayer assemblies every week and Prayer Meetings every two months.
3. **Family Nights & Resources** – Offer quarterly Family Nights and send home discipleship guides so church, home, and school reinforce the message of discipleship.
4. **Mentoring & Small Groups** – Have Bible College interns lead middle-school small groups and one-on-one check-ins; track participation.
5. **Milestones & Grade 9 Retreat** – Celebrate verse-mastery, baptism decisions, and service projects; culminate with the Grade 9 end-of-year retreat.

- Verse-mastery tracking (target ≥ 90 % by 2028)
- Annual student & parent focus-group feedback on discipleship growth

SERVANT LEADERSHIP GOAL:

Cultivate a K-9 culture of Christ-centred servant leadership that equips every student to influence others through humility, service, and godly character.

Strategies:

1. **Maxwell iLead Roll-out** – Pilot the values-based iLead curriculum in Grades K-9 leadership/health blocks and embed reflection questions in the lessons.
2. **ACSI Servant Leadership Summit** – Send a middle-school delegation annually and have delegates train peers on return.
3. **Service-Learning Projects** – Require each class to design at least one campus, church, or community project per term; log student service hours.
4. **Leadership Portfolios** – Maintain digital portfolios that document goals, reflections, and evidence of servant leadership growth.
5. **Servant Leadership Day** – Host an annual showcase where students present projects and testimonies to parents, the church, and community leaders.

- Average service hours per student (baseline 2025; grow 10 %/yr)
- Portfolio rubric scores on “humility, responsibility, influence”

QUALITY CHRISTIAN EDUCATION GOAL:

Deliver exemplary, Bible-rooted instruction and a thriving middle-school culture by strengthening teacher growth systems, deepening biblical-worldview integration, and ensuring leadership is moving the school's mission and vision forward and meeting the Alberta LQS.

Strategies:

1. **Enhanced Supervision & Evaluation** – Implement a three-cycle model (walk-throughs, formal observations, coaching) with a biblical-integration checklist.
2. **Targeted Professional Development** – Provide PD on faith-infused pedagogy, assessment literacy, and middle-school engagement; require evidence of transfer to practice.
3. **Middle-School Culture Initiative** – Develop a plan to create a healthy and flourishing middle-school culture of faith, respect, engagement, discipleship, and servant leadership.
4. **Curriculum Mapping & Coverage** – Develop a system to map Alberta outcomes and biblical connections; review progress each term.
5. **Principal Evaluation Committee** – Conduct an annual evidence-based review aligned with the Alberta LQS and mission/vision metrics; share findings with the board.




